



# Can I plant forsythia under photovoltaic panels

How do you plant a forsythia plant?

How to plant: When planting forsythia, choose a site with full sun to light shade and well-draining soil. Follow these steps and space plants 3 to 10 feet apart, depending on the variety. Loosen soil in the planting area to improve drainage. Dig a hole twice as wide and just as deep as the root ball.

How much sun does a forsythia need?

Pack the soil around the roots and water. Forsythia bushes grow best with at least six hours of direct sun on most days. If your plant gets less sun than this, it might not produce as many flowers. Forsythias prefer loose, well-draining soil--however, these tough plants show tolerance for clay soil, too.

Can Forsythia grow in pots?

Plant seedlings in the ground or larger pots in the spring after the last frost. Forsythia can grow in pots, and in fact, doing so can contain its aggressive spread. However, you will have to repot the plant every two or three years as it will grow larger.

How do you grow a forsythia in a container?

Forsythias can be found in nursery containers or shipped as bare-root plants. If the plant is in a container, dig a hole twice the container's width and the same depth. Set the plant in the hole at the same depth it was in the container. Fill the hole with good-quality soil and press it down around the roots.

How do you replant Forsythia?

Forsythia may be rejuvenated by cutting out a third of the older canes or cutting plants back hard to the ground, but sometimes replacement with a new cultivar is the best option. If the crown is buried beneath the soil or heavily mulched, this may impair root development, depriving plants of nourishment which can result in failure to set buds.

Is Forsythia invasive?

Forsythia is not on the USDA invasive plant list, but it does have its challenges. If the branches touch the ground, they can root and start new plants. Also, the roots can be difficult to eradicate if removal of the shrub is desired. Do bees and butterflies like forsythia?
