What is concentrating solar power & how does it work?

Learn the basics about concentrating solar power and how this technology generates energy. What is concentrating solar-thermal power (CSP) technology and how does it work? CSP technologies use mirrors to reflect and concentrate sunlight onto a receiver. The energy from the concentrated sunlight heats a high temperature fluid in the receiver.

What is concentrated solar power (CSP) & thermal energy storage (TES)?

Concentrated solar power (CSP) is a promising technology to generate electricity from solar energy. Thermal energy storage (TES) is a crucial element in CSP plants for storing surplus heat from the solar field and utilizing it when needed.

What is concentrated solar technology?

Concentrated-solar technology systems use mirrors or lenses with tracking systems to focus a large area of sunlight onto a small area. The concentrated light is then used as heat or as a heat source for a conventional power plant (solar thermoelectricity).

When did concentrated solar start?

No commercial concentrated solar was constructed from 1990 when SEGS was completed until 2006 when the Compact linear Fresnel reflector system at Liddell Power Station in Australia was built. Few other plants were built with this design although the 5 MW Kimberlina Solar Thermal Energy Plant opened in 2009.

Who invented concentrating solar energy?

One of the first prototypes for obtaining usable energy from concentrating solar radiation was developed by Augustin Mouchot, who presented it at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1878. That prototype was made up by a parabolic reflector working together with a vapor turbine that obtained ice from concentrated solar heat.
