

# Guinea-Bissau power works

Why did Guinea-Bissau Sign a deal with Karpowership?

In 2019, its government signed a deal with Karpowership, one of the world's biggest floating power plant operators, to supply the country with all its power. A spokesperson for the company told the BBC that Karpowership was "grateful" for Guinea-Bissau's efforts to pay the bill, which made it possible to resume electricity supplies.

How much power does Guinea Bissau receive?

Guinea Bissau receives a capacity of 27.5 MW and an energy share of 167 GWh per year from the Kalita (240MW) and Soaupiti (480MW) hydropower plants. The Power Purchase Agreement was signed in December 2019.

Why did Karpowership cut off electricity in Guinea-Bissau?

(This includes the Reuters Weekend Briefing.) Guinea-Bissau's capital was plunged into darkness on Tuesday after Turkish company Karpowership cut off electricity supplies to the West African nation due to an unpaid debt of \$17 million, the economy minister said.

Did Turkish company Karpowership restore power to Guinea-Bissau?

Turkish company Karpowership has restored power to Guinea-Bissau's capital after cutting off supplies over an unpaid bill of \$15m (£12m). The company resumed operations late on Wednesday after receiving a payment of \$6m from the government.

Is Karpowership supplying 100% of Guinea-Bissau's electricity?

Karpowership says it has been supplying 100% of Guinea-Bissau's electricity since signing a five-year agreement with the state-owned electricity and water utility company in 2019. The country is one of the poorest in the world and has been beset by instability since independence.

Does Guinea-Bissau have electricity?

Guinea-Bissau has one of the lowest electrification rates in Sub-Saharan Africa with only 29 percent of the population - around 53 percent in urban areas - having access to electricity (Figure 1).

Portugal's African colonies have not fared well in the post-independence era. Guinea-Bissau, although spared the calamitous civil wars that have wracked Mozambique and Angola, has failed to achieve adequate social and economic development and today remains one of the world's 15 poorest countries.

The Mansoa-Tanaff section of the line was commissioned in February 2024 enabling power imports from Senegal to Guinea-Bissau, and from Guinea to The Gambia through Guinea-Bissau. The Lomé-based African Biofuel & Renewable Energy Company (Abrec) has awarded a contract to Sinohydro to build a 20MWp solar plant at Gardete, 8km from Bissau, as well as a 30kV connection to the B&#244;r substation. Abrec said six eligible bids were received in an international tender that closed in May last year. Work is expected to take 16 months.

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There were also lingering tensions between PAIGC leaders from Guinea-Bissau and Cape Verde, where the party also took power after independence. Those tensions gave rise to a military coup in 1980, in which the former guerrilla commander Jo&#227;o Bernardo "Nino" Vieira ousted the country's first president, Lu&#237;s Cabral, brother of Am&#237;car.
