What is India's commitment to solar energy?

Another critical initiative underlining India's commitment to solar energy is the Solar Park Scheme, designed to establish 50 Solar Parks of 500 MW and above with a cumulative capacity of ~38 GW by 2025-26.

What is India's solar power installed capacity?

India's solar power installed capacity was 90.76 GW AC as of 30 September 2024. India is the third largest producer of solar power globally.

Which is the largest solar power plant in India?

How much does a solar power plant cost in India?

The Welspun Solar MP project, the largest solar-power plant in the state, was built at a cost of INR11 billion (US\$130 million) on 305 ha (3.05 km²) of land and will supply power at INR8.05 (9.6¢ US) per kWh.
