

# Industrial grid power output Cuba

MEXICO CITY - Cuba's power grid shut down on Friday, leaving the entire country without electricity. The massive outage leaves 10 million people on the Caribbean island without electricity.

Cuba has also made efforts to increase the use of renewable energy sources, such as wind and solar power, with the goal of achieving 24% of electricity generation from renewables by 2030. Despite these efforts, Cuba still experiences frequent power outages, particularly during the summer months when demand for electricity is highest.

Cuba's 2021 crude output reached 43,908 b/d, 6pc less than in 2020, the government said. According to official data, Cuba's oil demand is around 160,000 b/d. The island's power plants have 5.87GW of installed generating capacity, of which 3.2GW is operational, according to UNE. Power generation by the plants last week was 2.1GW.

Cuba said it was generating only enough electricity to cover about 1/6th of peak demand late on Wednesday, hours after its national grid collapsed leaving millions without power. The National Electric Union (UNE) said it was producing 533 MW of ...
