In recent years, Argentina has been working on overcoming such barriers and transitioning from high dependence on fossil fuels to a focus on renewable energy sources. According to a 2015 law (No. 27191), the share of renewable energy in Argentina is to reach 20% by 2025, with 126 projects currently operating and 90 under development.

In Argentina, all renewable energy purchased through these Rounds are known as Joint Purchases. The RenovAr Program includes a scheme that coordinates different levels of guarantees (payment and soveireign guarantees) designed within the framework of the Fund for the Development of
