Where are the Cocos Keeling Islands?

A half-day flight away from Perth, the Cocos Keeling Islands are located 900 km from Christmas Island. With just 144 visitors at any one time, you're more likely to see a turtle in the lagoon than another pair of fins. It's a simple, laid-back way of life here.

Why are the Cocos Islands called the Keeling Islands?

The territory's dual name (official since the islands' incorporation into Australia in 1955) reflects that the islands have historically been known as either the Cocos Islands or the Keeling Islands. The territory consists of two atolls made up of 27 coral islands, of which only two - West Island and Home Island - are inhabited.

What is the capital of Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The capital of the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands is West Island while the largest settlement is the village of Bantam, on Home Island. Governance of the islands is based on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955 and depends heavily on the laws of Australia.

How many people live in Cocos Keeling Islands?

The Cocos Keeling Islands have a total population of 600 people, including around 450 Cocos Malay. Covering a 10 km stretch end-to-end, West Island is best explored by car. Or if you're game, by bike. Explore palm jungle tracks, while away hours on endless white-sand beaches or spot tropical marine life at Trannies and Pulu Maraya.

How do I get from Cocos Keeling Island to home island?

If you have time for a little pre-planning and a spare eight hours up your Cocos Keeling Island holiday sleeve, talk to the Visitor Centre team on West Island about how to island walk, between Islands. You'll need to catch the ferry to Home Island - the service runs several times a day.

Is Cocos Keeling Islands a protected area?

In March 2022, Parks Australia declared the Cocos Keeling Islands marine park a protected area. So if you swim, snorkel, or dive, marvel at the many incredible species that have clung on to survive and thrive around the healthy reefs and in deeper ocean waters.
