The Department of Energy is aware of claims of offers for free solar panels or that solar companies must provide solar panels for free if requested. However, the federal government does not offer any programs for free home solar panel installations nor does the government require companies to grant solar panels for free to customers.

What is a solar photovoltaic (PV) device?

Solar photovoltaic (PV) devices, or solar cells, convert sunlight directly into electricity. Small PV cells can power calculators, watches, and other small electronic devices. Larger solar cells are grouped in PV panels, and PV panels are connected in arrays that can produce electricity for an entire house.

Are "free" solar panels a good idea?

The concept of "free" or "no-cost" solar panels really is too good to be true. "Free" solar panels are essentially rented from solar companies. While you will reap the benefits of cheaper electricity bills through solar power, you do not own the panels; the solar company does. Once your lease agreement is up, the panels will be removed.
